

WITNESSING ON THE STREETS

Here are four practical ways of witnessing on the streets.

1. BOARDS



You set up three boards in the form of a triangle on the pavement. At the top of each board is a question. Examples are:-

- What is the greatest thing you have ever done?
- What is the greatest ambition you have in your life?
- What is the greatest thing that has ever happened to you in your life?

You invite passers by to come and write on the boards answers to the questions underneath.

You engage them conversation and witness to Jesus.

2. HOT DOG AND A PRAYER



You find a place on a public street where you can erect your banner. You have a portable gas hob on which to keep water simmering containing tinned hotdogs. With rolls and sauce to complete the offering, you are set to go.

You invite people to receive a free hotdog and a prayer. Many will just want prayer.

- Would you like a hotdog?

- Would you like us to pray for you?
- Would you like us to pray for you now?

We witness that prayer works, all prayer is answered in some way or other etc.

3. QUESTIONNAIRE



You have a clipboard and a questionnaire, say two sides of one page. You ask people their opinion on certain things and write them down. At the end you give them the sheet with their answers and yours underneath.

Over the course of the questionnaire you witness to the Christian response to the questions.

4. A STALL IN A MARKET



A stall in a market gives a tangible presence of the Holy Spirit. 'Where two or more are gathered in my name', applies to market stalls as well.

In addition to considering the above three at the stall, there are all sorts of activities, for example:-

- a 'worry chair' – people who have a worry sit there, and are given tea or a coffee, and if they wish they can talk about their worries.
- giving away free bibles,
- money can be raised for charity from, for example, a stock of Christian greetings cards, book markers, Christian mugs, local produce donated to the stall, and so on.
